**Lorrain Franklin-Taylor** is a natural leader, a natural organizer and an incredible compassionate woman who exemplifies the best ideas of service in helping others. In 2006, she resigned her position as president of the Million Mom March – Oakland chapter and founded 1,000 Mothers to Prevent Violence, a grassroots non-profit organization in the memory of her twin sons: Albade and Obadiah (6-8-77 – 2-8-00), victims of violence. In 2010, Lorrain was honored as one of five national Jefferson Award winners who received a "silver medal" for public service and recognized as a Comcast-B.A.N.G. "Home Town Hero" for volunteer service. In 2007, she received a "Distinguished Leadership" Award presented by the Legal Community Against Violence. Lorrain earned both her BPA & MHR from USF. She has one son, Gregory Taylor, Jr.
